EMERGENCY STEPS FOR HANDLING A DRUNKEN WORKER:

- Ensure the worker stops operating machinery or performing dangerous tasks.
- Escort the worker to a safe, non-hazardous area.
- Avoid confrontation; remain calm and professional.
- Document the incident with factual details.
- Follow company policies for further action.
- Arrange safe transport if needed.

POTENTIAL HAZARDS OF SUBSTANCE ABUSE

- **Impaired Judgment** – Poor decisions and unsafe actions
- **Slow Reaction Time** – Increased risk of accidents and injuries
- **Reduced Coordination** – Unsafe operation of tools and machinery
- **Health Issues** – Addiction, organ damage, mental health problems
- **Workplace Incidents** – Higher risk of damage, injury, or fatalities
- **Legal Consequences** – Job loss, fines, or legal action

WORKPLACE POLICY & AWARENESS

- Follow all company alcohol and drug policies
- Zero tolerance for substance use during work hours
- Do not report to work under the influence
- Report any suspected substance abuse to supervisors
- Attend safety and awareness training
- Recognize signs of impairment in coworkers
- Use available support programs (EAP or HR support)

DO'S AND DON'TS

Do's

- Follow company rules and procedures
- Report unsafe behavior immediately
- Support coworkers in getting help
- Be aware of signs of impairment (slurred speech, erratic behavior)
- Use company support resources

Don'ts

- Do not bring alcohol or drugs to the workplace
- Do not ignore warning signs in others
- Do not operate equipment under the influence
- Do not assume substance use is acceptable during breaks/offsite
- Do not underestimate the seriousness of substance abuse

EMERGENCY STEPS (IF A WORKER IS IMPAIRED)

- Observe signs (unsteady movement, slurred speech)
- Inform supervisor discreetly
- Stop the worker from operating machinery
- Move them to a safe area
- Stay calm and avoid confrontation
- Document the incident clearly
- Follow company procedures
- Arrange safe transportation if required

CONCLUSION

Alcohol and drug use have no place in a safe workplace. Following company policies ensures the safety and well-being of everyone. If someone is struggling, support and help are available—creating a safe work environment is everyone's responsibility.
